Commissioner Henry called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

#### **Work Session:**

City of Monticello Transportation Planning Assistance:
 The City of Monticello is considering contracting with the Northeast Georgia Regional Commission for planning assistance including a traffic operations and parking plan for downtown Monticello.

Sheriff Pope noted that he met with DOT and they have a detailed comprehensive plan.

Chairman Henry noted GDOT had \$250,000 at one time to put toward it.

2. CGEMC Agreement Expediting Expansion of High Speed Internet Service:
The Board of Commissioners provided Central Georgia EMC with a draft agreement for expediting expansion of high speed broadband service to Jasper County residents served by CGEMC.

Comm. Stunkel noted he is concerned about a start date; gives potential for other counties to get ahead.

Chairman Henry noted they need to figure out a completion date.

Mr. Benton noted the start date is considered when they start measuring the poles.

3. Jasper County Public Facilities Authority Projects:
Comm. Stunkel noted they are looking at a 13-year bond to pay for jail; that's only using 60 percent of our funds. He further noted we need to decide on next project; multi-purpose building, roads, or water. He also noted we will need an architect to work with Jasper County Water and Sewer Authority and on the multi-purpose purpose facility.

Commissioner Henry suggested we start with Precision Planning.

Chief Finch noted that the frontline Ford went down yesterday, cost estimate is \$11,000.00. They have no spare. A new one would be about \$193, 053 and will not be available until March or April of 2022

#### Item 1: Capital Expenditures Projects- Fire Rescue, Public Works and Landfill:

Mike Benton gave an update of the funds that are available in different accounts.

Impact Fees- Fire Rescue- \$75,493

Impact Fees- Roads & Bridges- \$42,746

Fund 351-\$306,510

American Rescue Plan Fund-\$1,798,488

Fund Balance- \$7,345,927

Chris Finch (Fire Chief) discussed his capital needs for his department. The oldest truck in his fleet is almost 40 years old.

Commissioner Gerald Stunkel motioned to purchase two Frontline Fire Engines not to exceed \$700K, to be funded through the American Rescue Plan funds. Commissioner Ledford seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Chief Finch was asked to come back with some numbers for the roof repair.

Michael Walsh stood before the board to present his capital requests. He stated that he signed a contract for the preventative maintenance program. He stated that there will have to be some training for the program. The data will be stored in the cloud. One Brush cutter is not enough.

Commissioner Ledford motioned to approve the purchase of a Right away brush cutter not to exceed \$150K funded through American Rescue Funds. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Commissioner Jernigan motioned to purchase the 2022 Right away mower Tractor, John Deere 5090 E Cab Utility Tractor for \$55,896.94 to be funded from the American Rescue Plan Fund. Commissioner Stunkel seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Commissioner Stunkel motioned to approve the purchase of the 15' Flex Wing Rotary Cutter in not to exceed \$24,600 from Impact Fees. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Mr. Walsh stated that he has done a lot of maintenance and repairs on the current trucks in his fleet. He has replaced two motors. Once he have replacements most of the current ones will be junked. With the new trucks he can get 4 to a truck instead of squeezing in three.

The current service truck was came from the Fire Department. It is very old and tops at about 55 mph. They don't need a new truck but need something more dependable.

Commissioner Jernigan motioned that we approved the purchase of a the ¾ Ton Mechanic Service Truck (used)m 2—wheel drive, tool body with Lifting Crane for \$35,000 not to exceed \$50,000 funded by American Rescue Plan Fund. Commissioner Ledford seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Commissioner Ledford motion to approve the purchase of the 60" Loader Forks to not exceed \$6,000 to be funded by impact fees. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Commissioner Jernigan motioned to purchase the 2022 Skid Steer Compact Loader and the grapple attachment to be funded by the American Rescue Fund, not to exceed \$77K. Commissioner Ledford seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Commissioner Stunkel motioned to approve the purchase of the commercial Debris Blower not to exceed \$7,400 from impact fees. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Mr. Walsh discussed the status and conditions of the equipment that is currently at the Landfill.

Commissioner Stunkel made a motion to purchase the Excavator- 320L CAT not to exceed \$250K from the American Rescue Funds. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Commissioner Stunkel made a motion to approve up to \$60K expenditure for the purchase of a 4-door, 4-wheel drive, long-bed, diesel powered pick-up truck to be funded by the American Rescue Funds. Commissioner Ledford seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Chairman Henry stated that these are big purchases. He asked that the Fire Chief and Public Works Director provide a projected five-year plan on what they think they will need over the next five years in order for the Board to plan for it and not get hit by all of it at once.

Commissioner Stunkel mad a motion to fund up to \$50K for a new three quarter ton pick-up, long bed, 4-door, gas powered for Public Works. Commissioner Ledford seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

#### 1. By-Laws:

Mr. Benton noted that we could start with reviewing the by-laws and discuss the duties and responsibilities on page 4.

Mr. Benton reviewed the duties and responsibilities, power and jurisdiction, and enforcement.

Chairman Henry noted the board is an advisory board. He would like to see the board put together recommendations on how they would like to advise the Recreation Director. He further stated the Director of Recreation reports to the County Manager. The Board cannot give the Director and direction without going through the County Manager.

Miranda Hudson questioned if the Director should be at all the Rec Board meetings.

Dan Shives questioned why questions or concerns can't just go to Director and he go to County Manager.

Commissioner Stunkel noted in the event there is a situation where the Director may not want what the Rec Board wants; he may not advocate adequately.

Chairman Henry noted the chain of command should be used.

Mr. Benton asked that the Board revisit the schedule of Rec. Board meetings.

The boards had discussion about fees for travel ball.

Comm. Jernigan noted we would look to the Rec Board to set the fees for travel ball to rent the fields.

Ms. Hudson noted the fees currently are \$25 a d day to her understanding.

Mr. Minter noted the fees used to be \$75 per day and \$125 if they need lights.

Ms. Hudson noted there was a tournament held over the weekend and the Rec Board was not involved in any of it.

Comm. Ledford questioned who sets the fees for registration for sports.

Mr. Benton noted the Director and himself.

Mr. Minter noted, we are one of the cheapest registration fees compared to surrounding counties; we lose every year on cheerleading because the fees are so low.

Comm. Stunkel asked that Director Fleming join the conversation at the table.

Mr. Fleming noted they are looking at fees.

Ms. Hudson noted she would like to see the sponsorship program come back for kids whose families can't afford the registration fee.

Chairman Henry noted at one time the Rec Board held fundraisers.

Mr. Shives noted we need to be cautious with our fees, as our facilities are not as nice as other counties either.

Mr. Minter noted we also have to be careful about developing new programs, when we don't have the space.

Commissioners discussed the plans for the Recreation Park expansion.

Boards discussed how to handle concerns in terms of who to contact. It was suggested that a board or committee be formed to handle complaints. Complaints about personnel should go straight to county manager.

Mr. Shives noted he does not feel that the board should go to the Commissioners with problems.

Mr. Rosser reviewed the Athlete, Coaches, and Parent, and Park Policy with consequences spelled out.

Mr. Minter noted they need to have someone to keep stats that knows what they are doing. Theses stats help to pick all-stars.

Dan Shives noted he appreciates the Commissioners taking the time to have this conversation.

Rec Board members agreed to work on a meeting schedule and time and to elect officers. Ms. Pennamon questioned how the uniforms will be ordered in the future.

Mr. Fleming noted we use the same people as Jasper County and Piedmont Schools use.

1. A Public Hearing will be held for a Special Use Permit Request to operate a Campground/RV Park business from the property at 21575 Hwy 11, Monticello; Map & Parcel: 015 023 002 & 015 023 001

P&Z Director Judy Johnson presented the Special Use Permit Request to the BOC. The site is located on the west side of Hwy 11 North. It is zoned agricultural and is currently developed with a residential home. The planning commission recommend denial 5-0 based on traffic safety concerns. She provided criteria that is supposed to be used when considering a Special use permit. She read the recommended conditions if the request is approved:

If this petition is approved by the Board of Commissioners, it should be approved for a Special Use Permit for a Campground Business subject to the owner's agreement to the following enumerated conditions. Where these conditions conflict with the stipulations and offerings contained in the Letter of Intent, these conditions shall supersede unless specifically stipulated by the Board of Commissioners.

- 1. To the owner's agreement to restrict the use of the subject property as follows:
  - a. A Campground or recreational vehicle park only
- 2. To the owner's agreement to abide by the following development standards:

- a. A 50' landscape buffer shall be required along the road frontage of Hwy 11. Said landscape plan shall be done by a professional landscape architect or professional in the field and subject to the approval of the Director of Planning and Zoning.
- b. No campsite shall be rented for a period greater than days by the same person.
- c. Parking shall be designed in a way to be shielded from Hwy 11.
- d. Applicant shall provide a letter from the Georgia Department of Transportation either approving the use of the existing driveway or stating what improvements are necessary for the business. If improvements are to be made, the improvements shall be in place prior to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy for the building and the issuance of a business license.

### For- None Opposed

- A. Mary Patrick (Monticello) opposed. She stated that the location is a dangerous.
- B. <u>Kathy Benson (Lakeshore Drive)</u> Ms. Benson stated that she opposes because there are three campgrounds with a 10-12 mile radius of the proposed site.
- C. Allen Small (Liberty Church Road) He stated that he likes Jasper County the way it is.
- D. Shannon Honeycutt- (Jackson Lake Road) Mr. Honeycutt stated that the road is terrible with the curves and could not imagine multiple trailers trying to come in at one time.
- E. Jeff Williamson- (Barnes Mountain Road) Mr. Williamson stated that this property backs up to his property. He stated he have a big issue with people trespassing.
- F. Beth Durand (Wild Road) Ms. Durand stated that a special needs campground would not be a good idea.
- 2. A Public Hearing will be held on a Zoning Ordinance Amendment Ordinance amendment for Chapter 119 ZONING, subsection 119-2 (Definitions) to add the following definitions for Food Bank, Food Pantry, and Short Term Rental.

Judy Johnson presented the request for Zoning Ordinance Amendments. She read the amendment definitions into record for the BOC. The purpose of the definitions is to regulate.

#### For

Craig Garvin stood in favor of the definitions being added. He stated that he owns a short term rental in the area. He stated that he has never had issued with his rental but if they do he have terms in place to have them removed.

**Drew Buckner-** Stated that he have a property on Lakeshore drive and is in favor of having the definitions. He said that he would love to be a part of the solution. He stated that he only accepts renters that have great rental history. He has not had any calls on his property.

**David Swanson-** Stated that he owns a lake house on Eagle drive, has never had police called. He believes regulation is required and needed. He has five years of experience in other counties.

**Brinton Fields**- Eagle Drive- Stated that he does not allow parties at his short term rentals. Airbnb does not allow parties.

#### Opposed

Mary Patrick (Monticello) - said that she is not opposed but would like to know where she can read the definitions.

Jason Rider (Bragg Road) - Jason ask if there a timeframe for the definitions to be posted.

Bill Nash (Chickadee Court) - He stated that if short-term rental is defined and it's not listed as an allowable use in any zoning district would the owners be out of compliance.

1. A Public Hearing will be held on a Zoning Ordinance Amendment – Ordinance Amendment for Chapter 119 – ZONING, Subsection 119-269 – Table of Permitted Uses to add the following use to the Use Table as a Special Use Permit for a Public or nonprofit food & necessities distribution center/Food Bank/Food Pantry

Judy Johnson presented the application to add the Use of Public or Nonprofit Food & Necessities Distribution to the table of permitted use. She clarified the process of advertising the amendments. This will be added in agriculture as a special use as well as C1 and C2. If a use is not listed on the use table it is not an allowable use in a district.

#### **For**

**Tom Combs (Pine Tree Road, Monticello)** - Mr. Combs stated that he has been with the food bank for 13 plus years. He gave some history of how the Food Bank was started.

Henry Dennis (Pastor of Freedonia CME Church) - He stated that he is in favor of it because we are supposed to feed the hungry. He voiced his concerns about the condition of the road. He ask that the county pave the street. He stated that the church will offer any partnership that they can to help assist the Food Bank.

Willie Harris (Middlebrook Pond Road) - Mr. Harris stated that he is in favor and would like to volunteer at the Food Bank when the time comes.

#### **Opposed**

Mary Patrick (Monticello) - Ms. Patrick stated that she opposes the Food Bank being in the Agriculture district. There is going to be a lot of traffic and this should be in the Commercial zoning. She stated that the guy wanted to partner with him and she thinks they already gave them \$125,000 of taxpayer money and got the grant and land.

Commissioner Stunkel motioned to go back into regular meeting at 6:53 p.m. Commissioner Ledford seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Randolph Epps (Killdeer Lane) - Mr. Epps stated that would like for the Board to Vote yes to pave Killdeer Lane. He stated that it is very dangerous trying to get onto Turtle Cove Trailway. He stated that it's like you have to race up the hill just to get on the pavement.

**Kathy Benson-** Ms. Benson talked about her concerns with short term rentals.

Robert Peek (Jackson Lake Road) - Mr. Peek stated that he moved here to be in the country. He stated that everything is changing. His road was postponed because they can't keep up with stuff. He ask why would they continue to let all of this stuff come in. None of the departments can handle the growth.

<u>Item 4: Recreation Board Discussion/Future Joint Work Session:</u> Commissioner Jernigan state that for several months to a year there have been problems between the Recreation Director, the Recreation Board and the Public. He stated that he believes it is time to make some changes to the Rec board. He stated that he would like us to relieve all current members of the Rec Board and appoint new members.

Commissioner Jernigan motioned to remove the current members of the Recreation Board and appoint new members. Commissioner Ledford seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

<u>Item 5: Jasper County Recreation Board Appointment:</u> Commissioner Jones stated that she feels that she can be of help and come with different ideas to help the Recreation Staff.

Commissioner Stunkel motioned to appoint Commissioner Sheila Jones to the Recreation Board. Commissioner Ledford seconded the motion, passed 4-0 (Commissioner Jones abstained).

Mr. Jeff Holloway stated that he is currently the Athletic Director for the Jasper County Charter System. He stated that he works with the current director. He would like to help out.

Commissioner Jernigan motioned to appoint Jeff Holloway to the Recreation Board. Commissioner Ledford seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

<u>Item 6: Jasper County Water and Sewer Authority Board Appointment:</u> The applicant was not in the room.

Commissioner Stunkel motioned to table the item. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

<u>Item 7: Landfill Customer Types Discussion:</u> Commissioner Stunkel motioned to table the item. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

<u>Item 8: County Extension- Capital Expenditure Item- Quotes for Consideration:</u> Kasey Hall (Extension Office) discussed quotes that she was able to obtain. She mentioned all of the vehicles she test drove and dealerships that she visited.

Commissioner Stunkel motioned to approve the purchase of a vehicle by the County Extension Office at the Carl Black dealership with a purchase price of up to \$45K. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, passed 4-1, Chairman Henry opposed.

<u>Item 9: Recreation Park- Capital Expenditure Items- Quotes for Consideration:</u> Brandon Williams (Assistant Rec Director) presented quotes for consideration for Utility Vehicles and Zero Turn Mower.

Commissioner Jernigan stated that we have had problems in the past with Hays Tractor.

Michael Walsh (PW Director) stated that the one negative that he have had was the fact that Hays would not touch some brush cutters that were purchased from them to repair them.

Commissioner Jernigan motioned to table Capital Expenditure Items until a later date. Commissioner Stunkel seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

<u>Item 10: 2023 Comprehensive Plan Update- Steering Committee Appointments:</u> Judy Johnson stated that the Comprehensive Plan is due October 2023. She suggested steering committee is needed. Northeast GA has suggested that the county appoints 3-4 individuals. The need to be one elected official, one business owner or member of the Development Authority and one to two citizens at large. The meetings will be led by NEGRC. The City of Shady Dale and the City of Monticello will have representatives. The person will need to have a flexible schedule because they will need to be at most meetings. She ask that an ad be placed in the newspaper.

Item 11: 2023 SPLOST Referendum- March Ballot/November Ballot: Chairman Henry stated that he and Mike met with the Registrar.

Mike Benton stated that the current SPLOST collection month is March 2024. Assuming the BOC wants to continue the SPLOST. It will need to be placed on the ballot. The Registrar is concerned about the mechanics having SPLOST on the November 2023 which will is a City Election only. They strongly recommended March 2023.

Chairman Henry stated if we plan to try to get the SPLOST referendum we will need to come up with our needs for it by the end of December. This will allow the paperwork to be submitted to the Secretary of State.

Commissioner Stunkel motioned to place the SPLOST question on the March 21, 2023 election ballot. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Commissioner Stunkel motioned to put the 2023 SPLOST towards roads in the county. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

<u>Item 12: Travel Policy Update- Meals Per Diem:</u> Mike Benton stated that staff have been asked to update the travel policy as it relates to Per Diem for meals. The current rate is \$35 per day.

Commissioner Ledford stated that the word required needs to be changed in the policy. Commissioner Ledford motioned to adopt the Travel Expense Policy as presented with the change of removing the word 'required' in section A.

- a. When a County employee is required to attends a training or certification seminar or conference, he/she shall be reimbursed for fair and reasonable expenses incurred for registration, food and lodging.
- b. If the county employee is required to furnish his/her own transportation, he/she shall receive mileage reimbursed at the standard IRS reimbursement rate.
- c. All expenses for meals will be reimbursed at the <u>standard rates</u> of reimbursement set by the United States General Services Administration.
- d. The County will NOT reimburse any expenses for alcoholic beverages or in-room movies,
- e. All County employees must utilize the appropriate "Expense Reimbursement" form for reimbursement.

Commissioner Stunkel seconded the motion, passed 4-1, Commissioner Jernigan opposed.

<u>Item 13: Credit Card Policy- Credit Card Issuance:</u> Mike Benton stated that staff was instructed to identify the process and procedure on issuing County Credit Cards to elected officials for County Official Business. The Elected official will have to sign the agreement section of the credit card.

Commissioner Jones stated that the only persons that should be checking out the credit card are the department heads.

Mr. Benton stated that we currently don't have a credit card policy at all. This card would be more of a travel credit card.

Chairman Henry stated that if the board chooses to pass the new card policy he does not want one.

Commissioner Ledford motioned to deny the credit card issuance to the Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

<u>Item 14: Jasper County Public Facilities Authority- Next Project:</u> Commissioner Jernigan stated that the Public Facilities Authority is asking for guidance on what the next project should be. He stated that he hear the concerns that there are immediate needs of fields. The PFA have to be instructed on what the next project is if there is a next project.

Commissioner Stunkel stated that we need to push Precision Planning for a firm quote. We also need to check with our Bond Agent on what we can borrow against our Stanton Springs income and over what period.

Mike Benton stated that the Recreation Director is out of commission for a little while which could delay the work session.

<u>Item 15: 2023 CDBG Program Discussion:</u> Chairman Henry stated that the window is open to apply for a CDBG grant.

Mike Benton stated that we have to have 75% of the previous grant spent before applying for the next grant application.

Commissioner Jernigan ask if the grants can be used for ballfields.

Mr. Benton stated that you will have to show a true need and low income benefits.

Item 16: Killdeer Lane- Blount Proposal- Safety and Maintenance Improvements: Mike Benton stated that Killdeer Lane has a public safety hazard and maintenance issue

Commissioner Stunkel stated that if you do stop you will spin your tires endlessly just to get onto the pavement.

#### **Blount Construction Proposal**

#### Option A

Resurface the entire length of Killdeer Lane with 2" of asphalt 520' - \$28,092

#### Option B

Resurface Killdeer Lane from Turtle Cove Trailway down to the bottom of the hill with 2" of asphalt 255' length - \$14,833

Commissioner Stunkel motioned to approve Option A of the Blount Construction: Resurface the entire length of Killdeer Lane with 2" of asphalt to be funded by Fund Balance. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Michael Walsh stated that there is minimal preparation needed.

Item 17: Miss Sarah Road- Abandonment Application- County Initiated: Mike Benton stated that staff is requesting approval of the Board of a County initiated application to abandon a certain section of Miss Sarah Drive. The approximate size of the abandonment will be about 800 ft. All processes and procedures will be observed except the \$500 application fee.

Commissioner Stunkel motioned to allow staff to move forward with the Road Abandonment Application process and to waive the \$500 application fee. Commissioner Ledford seconded the motion, passed unanimously.

Commissioner Stunkel stated that we will need to put some type of barricade in place for the section that is being abandon.

**WHEREAS,** Division 2., Agricultural and Residential Districts of the Code of Ordinances Part II, Chapter 119 entitled Zoning ("Zoning Ordinance"), and in Chapter 105 entitled Development Standards and Regulations that residential development is permitted in applicable zoning districts; and

WHEREAS, these sections contain various regulations and restrictions with respect to residential development, including allowed densities, lot size, accessory uses, accessory uses permitted upon the issuance of a conditional use permit, and other development conditions and standards; and

WHEREAS, recent development trends in the County suggest that current trends for residential development may not be adequately addressed by the current Zoning Ordinance and the Development Standards and Regulations; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board has directed the Planning and Zoning Department to evaluate possible revisions to the Code of Ordinances with respect to new planned residential development; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning and Zoning Department is in the process of reviewing current status and preparing possible amendments to the Code of Ordinances; and

**WHEREAS,** the Supreme Court has held that a moratorium with respect to application of a Zoning Ordinance may be put in place for a reasonable period of time without the necessity of complying with notice requirements of the Georgia Zoning Procedures Law ("ZPL"); and

WHEREAS, on January 3, 2022, the Board adopted a moratorium barring through and until July 5, 2022 and further extended until October 3, 2022, after a properly advertised public hearing the acceptance of applications for Residential Subdivision Preliminary Plat Petitions; and,

**WHEREAS,** the Board will conduct a properly noticed public hearing on October 3, 2022, to consider the possible extension of the Existing Moratorium;

**WHEREAS,** the Board finds to further extend a moratorium barring until November 14, 2022, the acceptance of applications of Residential Subdivision Preliminary Plat Petitions to be reasonably necessary, the least restrictive means available, a reasonable exercise of the County's police power, and in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Board of Commissioners of Jasper County, Georgia as follows:

- 1. The Jasper County Board of Commissioners does hereby enact a moratorium barring until November 14, 2022, the acceptance of applications of Residential Subdivision Preliminary Plat Petitions.
- 2. The moratorium imposed by this Resolution shall terminate on the earliest date of (1) November 14, 2022 at 11:59 p.m.; (2) approval by the Jasper County Board of Commissioners of an additional moratorium after a public hearing; or (3) the adoption of an amendment to the current language of the Zoning Ordinance and the Development Standards and Regulations.
- 3. This Resolution shall be effective upon a majority vote by the Board of Commissioners.

## **Summary:**

County Fire Departments, Water Systems and Communications Centers are audited every five years by the Insurance Services Office, Inc. commonly refered to as the ISO rating. The ISO rating has a direct bearing on every county resident's and business's insurance premiums. Jasper County's ISO audit is currently underway. One critical component of the ISO audit is the existence of fire fighting training facilities. In order to receive credit toward the Countywide ISO rating, which would help lower resident's and business's insurance premiums, ISO requires County fire fighting training exercises to be conducted on property owned by the County.

Jasper County Fire Rescue conducts its fire fighting training at Jasper County Fire Station #3 located at 185 Hwy 212 West, Monticello.

Currently, the official ownership of the property where Fire Station #3 is located is owned by the City of Monticello.

#### **Background:**

Jasper County Fire Station # 3 is located at 185 Hwy 212 West, Monticello.

Fire Station property is located on two separate tax parcels.

Parcel # 034016001 – Fire House Building

Ingles Markets, Inc. donated Parcel # 034016001 to the City of Monticello in 2002.





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# LIMITED WARRANTY DEED CONVEYING FEE SIMPLE DETERMINABLE

This LIMITED WARRANTY DEED CONVEYING FEE SIMPLE DETERMINABLE (the "Deed") is made and entered into as of the Adaptive of December, 2001, by INGLES MARKETS, INCORPORATED, a North Carolina corporation, party of the first part (hereinafter referred to as "Grantor"), in favor of the CITY OF MONTICELLO, GEORGIA, a political subdivision of the State of Georgia, party of the second part (hereinafter referred to as "Grantee") ("Grantor" and "Grantee" to include their respective successors, legal representatives and assigns where the context requires or permits).

#### WITNESSETH:

GRANTOR, in consideration of the sum of Ten and No/100 Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed and by these presents does hereby grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey and confirm unto GRANTEE all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in Land Lot 37 of the 16th District (and Georgia Militia District 295) of Jasper County, Georgia, as more particularly described in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference (hereinafter referred to as the "Land"), for so long as the Land is used for "Public Purposes" (as hereinafter defined). At such time as the foregoing period of limitation, as further described and defined herein, shall cease to endure, then and thereupon all of Grantee's right, title and interest in and to the Land shall immediately and automatically cease, determine and terminate and the Land shall automatically and absolutely revert to Grantor without any act

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(including, without limitation, re-entry or suit) by Grantor, and no act or omission on the part of Grantor shall be a waiver of the operation or enforcement of such limitation.

Without expanding by implication the scope of the limited warranty contained hereinbelow, the estate in the Land hereby conveyed is being conveyed in all respects subject to the matters (the "Permitted Exceptions") described in <a href="Exhibit B">Exhibit B</a> attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the Land, with all and singular the rights, members and appurtenances thereof, to the same being, belonging, or in anywise appertaining, to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of Grantee for the full estate conveyed hereby (being a FEE SIMPLE DETERMINABLE, Grantor retaining a possibility of reverter), subject to the Permitted Exceptions.

Grantor and Grantee hereby state their mutual understanding, intent and desire that the possibility of reverter to Grantor hereunder is not and shall not be subject to the Rule Against Perpetuities or any rule of law with respect to remoteness of vesting of property interests (including, without limitation, O.C.G.A. § 44-6-201), and Grantee hereby covenants and agrees that Grantee will not make any contrary assertion, contention, claim or counterclaim, or seek the right or benefit of the Rule Against Perpetuities or other such rule of law, in any action, suit or other legal proceeding involving Grantor, Grantee or the Land. In the event, however, that the Rule Against Perpetuities, or any rule of law with respect to remoteness of vesting of property interests, shall be held to limit the time within which the possibility of reverter to Grantor hereunder must vest or may be valid or enforceable, then the applicable period of time for purposes of the Rule Against Perpetuities or other such rule of law within which the possibility of reverter to Grantor hereunder must vest shall be measured as that period commencing on the date of this Deed and terminating on the date which is twenty-one (21) years from and after the date of the death of the last survivor of (i) Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland; (ii) His Royal Highness Prince Charles Philip Arthur George Windsor, Prince of Wales; (iii) His Royal Highness Prince William Arthur Philip Louis Windsor; (iv) His Royal Highness Prince Henry Charles Albert David Windsor; (v) His Royal Highness Prince Andrew Albert Christian Edward Windsor, Duke of York; (vi) His Royal Highness Prince Edward Antony Richard Louis Windsor; (vii) Her Royal Highness Princess Anne Elizabeth Alice Louise Windsor; and (viii) His Royal Highness Prince Philip Mountbatten, Duke of Edinburgh.

Grantor and Grantee specifically acknowledge and agree that the estate conveyed hereby is expressly intended by the parties to be a fee simple determinable on special limitation, with a possibility of reverter being retained by Grantor, and that, accordingly, the limitation contained within this Deed is not a covenant restricting lands to certain uses as contemplated by O.C.G.A. §44-5-60(b) (the "Section") and, thus, shall not be limited in effect in any manner after the expiration of twenty (20) years from the date of this Deed. Grantee hereby covenants and agrees that Grantee will not make any contrary assertion, contention, claim or counterclaim, or seek the right or benefit of such Section, in any action, suit or other legal proceeding involving Grantor, Grantee or the Land. In the event, however, that the limitation contained within this Deed nevertheless may be construed as a covenant restricting lands to certain uses within the meaning

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of the Section, the Section shall not apply to this Deed or the limitation stated herein in any manner, due to the stated intent of the parties that the limitation is in favor of and for the mutual benefit of both Grantor and Grantee as owner of the estate hereby conveyed in the Land as held for Public Purposes as contemplated by O.C.G.A. §44-5-60(c); provided further, however, that, without in any way limiting the intent, understanding and agreement of the parties that the limitation within this Deed is not a covenant restricting lands to certain uses such as is affected by the Section, the limitation set forth herein shall in any event be given effect in all circumstances for the maximum period permitted by the laws of the State of Georgia.

Grantee further acknowledges its agreement that the limitation set forth herein is reasonable and does not constitute an unreasonable restraint on alienation. Grantee hereby covenants and agrees that Grantee will not make any contrary assertion, contention, claim or counterclaim, or seek the right or benefit of the Rule Against Unreasonable Restraints on Alienation (as same may be recognized in the State of Georgia) or any other similar rule of law in any action, suit or other legal proceeding involving Grantor, Grantee or the Land. In the event, however, that the Rule Against Unreasonable Restraints on Alienation or any other similar rule of law shall be held applicable to the within limitation, in any manner, then it is the mutual intent of the parties that the within limitation shall be enforced to the maximum extent allowed by the laws of the State of Georgia.

For purposes of this Deed, the term "Public Purposes" shall be deemed to mean and include only the use of the Land by Grantee for the construction and operation thereon of a municipal fire station or municipal offices (i.e., offices of one or more departments of the City of Monticello) (collectively, the "Permitted Uses"), subject to the further provisions of this paragraph. Any other provision of this Deed to the contrary notwithstanding, for all purposes the use of the Land for Public Purposes shall be deemed to have ceased, and Grantee's estate in the Land shall thereupon terminate in accordance with the provisions of this Deed, if (i) at any time the Land is used for any retail or other commercial or "for-profit" purpose, (ii) not later than eighteen (18) months after the date of this Deed, Grantee fails to construct and commence the operation of a municipal fire station on the Land, or (iii) at any time after the construction and commencement of operation of a municipal fire station by Grantee on the Land within the period prescribed in clause (ii) above, the Land ceases to be used by Grantee for the Permitted Uses for a period of twenty-four (24) months or longer.

AND GRANTOR WILL, to the full extent of the estate conveyed hereby, warrant and forever defend the right and title to the Land unto Grantee against the claims of all persons claiming by, through or under Grantor, but not otherwise, except in all events for claims arising under or by virtue of the Permitted Exceptions.
