The GMVHOF Annual Induction Ceremony & Banquet is held each year on the first Saturday in November at which time Georgia Veterans are inducted. Since 2013, <u>162</u> Georgia Veterans have been inducted.

* WHERE

The GMVHOF, with the citations and photos of 162 Georgia Veterans (to date), is located on the Plaza and Balcony Lobby levels of the Floyd Veterans Memorial Building (Twin Towers) at 2 Martin Luther King Drive, NE, Atlanta, GA 30034. The Floyd Building is across the street from the Georgia Capitol Building and is open Monday - Friday, 6 AM - 6 PM, closed Saturday & Sunday.

* HOW

<u>Nomination Packets</u>: The GMVHOF can accept Nomination Packets through <u>COB</u>, <u>31 July</u> for the Induction Ceremony to be held in November of that year. Once it has been determined that the Nomination Packets are complete, <u>only</u> the <u>Cover Letters</u> are electronically forwarded to an Independent Selection Committee (ISC). The ISC members do not know each other, never meet as a group, never communicate with each other in any manner, and must not reveal the fact that they serve on the ISC. This ensures a totally un-biased, un-influenced, "blind", and fair process. All packets are automatically considered for up to three consecutive years with no additional effort required after initial submission.

PCO #003 - Owner to provide polished concrete by others. This change includes the credit to not complete the sealed concrete scope.

PCO #006 - Structural, finishes, detention, mechanical and electrical changes between GMP drawing set and final permit set dated 3/21/2023.

PCO #007 - As directed by the local permit authority, additional scope was required to completely re-work the existing grease trap and septic tank, which were scheduled to remain as is. This additional scope included:

- Remove existing septic tank and ATU

- Install new 1500 gallon septic tank

- Install new 1000 gallon ATU, including electrical service and post mounted electrical box.

PCO #008 - Per the direction of Jasper County, and in lieu of a new retaining wall west to the Administration addition, the existing water line was relocated across Mack Tillman Dr. The city water department provided the piping materials, and public works provided the stone and asphalt patches. This change is limited to the labor and equipment costs required for this additional scope.

PCO #012 - As planed within the original design, the new septic field for the Administration addition was to be placed directly across the parking lot from the addition. However, as required by the Local Permit Authority, due to existing soils, the new septic field is required to be placed appoximately 200' further from the planned location.

PCO #013 - Per the evaluation performed by NOVA on 8/1/2023 at the foundations and continuous spread footings of Housing building addition, is was determined that the majority of the existing subgrade did not meet the required structural load bearing capacity. NOVA recommended the unsuitable soils be removed and replaced with crushed stone base. County Public Works furnished the stone and this change includes the labor and equipment to overexcavate the footings to the extent directed by NOVA.

PCO #15 - As a continuation of the additional scope required due to non-structural existing soils at Housing, the NOVA directed stone underlayment was wider than the designed footings. This change includes the additional labor, materials and equipment to either form the footings to match the structural design within the overexcavation, or place concrete in the wider excavation.

The majority of the footings were formed and after placement, striped. The attached detail includes the actual time, materials and equipment to perform this additional scope. At some locations the excavation was only slightly wider than the designed footing width, therefore it was more cost effective to place additional concrete than to provide manpower, materials and equipment to form and strip. Similarly, the attached detail summarizes the actual labor and material for that additional scope.

We are adding 2 new card readers to the evidence area. There are 2 holding cells that will need corner mount cameras for monitoring of the inmates in there. And 2 cameras are being changed to audio enabled in the lobby.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, NCOA is a non-profit organization which educates, provides research and advocates for public policy issues to improve the lives of older Americans and wishes to engage Contractor to make available experts to perform certain services on behalf of NCOA as described in this Agreement;

WHEREAS, Contractor has expertise and experience in providing the services described in the attached Statement(s) of Work and has agreed to provide services to NCOA in its area of expertise.

WHEREAS, NCOA desires to retain the services of Contractor and Contractor desires to render such services on the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, and in consideration of mutual promises and covenants set forth hereunder, the parties agree as follows:

Provision of Services by Contractor.

Services. Contractor agrees to perform for NCOA the services described in the Statement(s) of Work attached hereto and made a part hereof referencing this Agreement (each, a "SOW") as may be mutually agreed upon and signed by both parties. Such services, including without limitation, any deliverables and work product to be furnished by Contractor, are hereinafter referred to as the "Services." SOW Number 1 is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u>.

<u>Fees and Expenses</u>. As compensation for the Services, NCOA will pay to Contractor the fees set forth in the applicable SOW. Payment terms will be as described in each SOW.

<u>Taxes</u>. Contractor will pay any and all Federal, state, local or foreign sales, excise, service, use, valueadded and other governmental taxes or assessments, however designated, with respect to the Services, payments hereunder or otherwise arising out of this Agreement (collectively, "Taxes). NCOA will not withhold any funds from Contractor for Taxes or other governmental purposes.

Contractor Responsibilities.

 Contractor shall perform Services diligently and in a workmanlike manner in accordance with industry standards and will use its reasonable commercial efforts to meet the needs and requirements of NCOA.

 Contractor shall manage the work of all staff retained on its behalf to perform Services and shall provide all equipment, materials and supplies to its personnel assigned to perform Services hereunder at its expense.

4. Examinations

4.01 <u>Audits, Inspections and Inquiries</u>. In the event Contractor is notified of any regulatory inspection or other audit or inquiry that relates to any Services provided under this Agreement, Contractor shall: (a) promptly notify NCOA of any such inspection or inquiry; (b) forward to NCOA copies of any correspondence from the regulatory agency relating to any such inspection or inquiry; and (c) seek the applicable Client's consent before referring to any Client in any correspondence responding or relating to any such regulatory inspection or inquiry (or related regulatory correspondence).

Term and Termination

5.01 <u>Term</u>. This Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and continue until April 30, 2024, unless terminated earlier in accordance with the provisions of this Section 5 (the "Initial Term").

5.02 <u>Termination for Material Breach</u>. In the event either party defaults in any material obligation in this Agreement, the non-defaulting party shall give written notice of such default. If the party in default has not cured the default within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notice, the non-defaulting party may terminate this Agreement by delivering notice thereof to the defaulting party.

5.03 <u>Termination for Insolvency</u>. In the event that either party becomes insolvent (i.e., becomes unable to pay its debts in the ordinary course of business as they come due) or makes assignment of this Agreement for the benefit of creditors, the other party may terminate this Agreement immediately upon written notice.

5.04 <u>Termination for Convenience</u>. Unless otherwise provided in a SOW, NCOA may terminate this Agreement or any SOW upon at least thirty (30) days advance written notice to Contractor.

5.05 <u>Effect of Termination</u>. Termination or expiration of this Agreement shall automatically terminate all services provided, and licenses granted, by the parties hereunder. NCOA shall be liable for any fees and expenses incurred by Contractor prior to the effective date of termination.

Confidentiality.

6.01 Confidential Information. During the term of this Agreement, each party may receive or have access to information that is confidential or proprietary to the other party (the "Confidential Information"). Confidential Information shall mean sensitive or proprietary materials and information, in whatever form, written, oral or otherwise, and shall include, but shall not be limited to (i) the distinctive methods or procedures which a party utilizes in the conduct of its business, (ii) each party's existing or future business models, relationships, plans, products and services marketed or planned to be marketed by such party; (iii) information relating to a party's general business operations, including but not limited to, sales, costs, profits, organizations, promotions, leads, ideas and methods and pricing structures; (iv) the terms and pricing under this Agreement, (v) a party's business processes and strategies, (vi) all Client information and data, including personally-identifiable information provided by Clients and (vii) all information clearly identified by a party as confidential. Confidential information shall not include information that, as evidenced by documentary evidence: (a) is or becomes generally available to the public through no act or omission of the receiving party or its personnel; (b) was in the receiving party's lawful possession prior to the disclosure and had not been obtained by the disclosing party either directly or indirectly from the disclosing party or from a third party who such party knows or should know is under an obligation of confidentiality with NCOA; (c) is lawfully disclosed to the receiving party by a third party without restriction on disclosure; (d) is independently developed by the receiving party without reference to the Confidential Information; or (e) is obligated to be disclosed by court order or government requirement. For purposes of this Agreement, a "Client" of NCOA means any business partner (including any corporation, partnership, governmental organization, joint venture, health plan, educational institution, not-for-profit organization, community senior center and other party with whom NCOA engages in any business transaction), business associate and any party that provides information to NCOA, including members of the general public.

6.02 <u>Nondisclosure</u>. Each party agrees to hold the other party's Confidential Information in confidence during the term of this Agreement and at all times after termination or expiration of this Agreement. The parties agree not to make the Confidential Information available in any form to any third party (provided that Contractor may make the terms and pricing of this Agreement available to auditors and legal counsel who are bound by confidentiality obligations with respect thereto) or to use the Confidential Information for any purpose other than the implementation of this Agreement. Each party agrees to take all

reasonable steps to ensure that Confidential Information is not disclosed or distributed by any person or entity in violation of the terms of this Agreement. Within thirty (30) days after any request made from time to time by the disclosing party, the receiving party shall return to the disclosing party, or at the disclosing party's direction destroy, and certify to the disclosing party in writing that the original and all copies, in whole or in part, of the Confidential Information have been returned to the disclosing party or destroyed. If a party is compelled to disclose any of the Confidential Information by court order or government regulation, it will disclose only that portion thereof which it is compelled to disclose and shall reasonably cooperate with the disclosing party's efforts to obtain an order or other reliable assurance that confidential treatment will be accorded to the Confidential Information so disclosed. Each party shall promptly inform the other party in the event such party learns of any disclosure of Confidential Information.

Warranties.

7.01 <u>Services Warranties</u>. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, such causes include acts of God, the public enemy, fires, floods, storms, earthquakes, riots, terrorism, strikes, blackouts, wars or war operations, restraints of government, utility or communications failures, computer malfunctions and equipment failure, computer hackers, telecommunications slow-downs or failure, or other causes which could not with reasonable diligence be controlled or prevented by the party.

10.09 <u>Governing Law; Venue</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the federal laws of the United States and the laws of the State of Delaware, without regard to its conflicts of laws rules. Each party hereby irrevocably submits to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the state and federal courts located in the Commonwealth of Virginia for any action arising under this Agreement.

10.10 Injunctive Relief. The parties acknowledge that violations of Sections 1.05(vi) and 6 of this Agreement may result in irreparable harm to the non-violating party for which remedies other than injunctive relief may be inadequate, and that the non-violating party shall be entitled to receive from a court of competent jurisdiction injunctive or other equitable relief to restrain such unauthorized acts in addition to other appropriate remedies. In the event of any claimed breach of any provisions of this Agreement, and in the event a party requests any injunctive relief or other relief in equity to stop or enjoin any act or acts by the other party, the parties agree that should such relief be granted by any court, that the requesting party shall not be required to post any bond or other surety as a pre-condition to such relief being granted and enacted.

10.11 <u>Notices</u>. All notices and demands under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be sufficient if sent by fax, registered mail or courier service in English, in each instance with confirmation of receipt, to the other party at its address given below, or at another address designated by such party in writing at a later time. A notice shall be deemed given on the date it was received.

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10.12 <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the complete and exclusive statement of the terms and conditions between the parties regarding the subject matter hereof, and supersedes all prior negotiations, agreements and representations regarding the subject matter hereof. There are no other agreements or representations not set forth herein. The Agreement shall not be modified except by a written instrument, signed by an authorized representative of both parties.

10.13 <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in two (2) or more counterparts, each of which shall be considered an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same document, binding on all parties notwithstanding that each of the parties may have signed different counterparts. The exchange of a fully executed Agreement, in counterparts or otherwise, by facsimile or electronic scanning shall be sufficient to bind the parties to the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

EXHIBIT A

Statement of Work No. 1

This Statement of Work No. 1 ("Statement of Work") is entered into by and between NCOA and Contractor under a certain Agreement for Contracted Services dated as of July 11, 2023 (the "Agreement"), and is incorporated by reference into and made a part of the Agreement. Any capitalized terms not defined in this Statement of Work shall have the meaning set forth in the Agreement.

1. Statement of Work Effective Date: July 11, 2023

2. Scope of Services:

The purpose of this contract is for Contractor to provide services related to COVID-19 and flu vaccine outreach and vaccinations to older adults and people with disabilities in its catchment area. Specifically, Contractor will:

- Provide a minimum of 100 vaccinations to older adults and/or people with disabilities. Vaccinations
 must be either COVID-19 or flu, or a combination of both. (Contractor may offer additional
 vaccinations, but <u>only</u> COVID-19 and flu vaccines will be counted toward the goals of this
 agreement.)
- Attend required onboarding and regular technical assistance meetings held by NCOA staff.
- Use NCOA-branded templates for marketing and outreach materials.
- Send vaccination data to NCOA. NCOA will supply a template for the vaccination data. Data is expected to include type of vaccination administered and date of vaccination.
- Provide composite demographic data of members/participants served in catchment area.
- OPTIONAL: Report one vaccine success story to NCOA.
- 3. **Target Completion Date:** All Services will be completed by April 30, 2024. The following deliverables shall be completed on or before the target completion date of this agreement:
 - 100 vaccinations administered to older adults and/or people with disabilities.
 - Data on vaccinations administered sent to NCOA upon completion of required 100 vaccinations and at the end of the project period.
 - Attendance at mandatory onboarding and technical assistance meetings.

4. Fees and Payment Terms:
